### *Director's Message*

The works of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle have been cherished around the world for 130 years. A Study in Scarlet first introduced the world to the great duo of Sherlock Holmes and Dr. John H. Watson in The Beeton's Christmas Annual in 1887. Spanning 56 short stories, and 4 novels, Doyle's work has inspired multiple generations of artists to take on the many adventures of Holmes and Watson. Back in January of 2017 my wife and I decided to read 30 books this year. While I am woefully behind in that challenge, it led to me grabbing the first thing that interested me on our bookshelf, The Complete Sherlock Holmes: Volume One. After reading the first novel, A Study in Scarlet, I decided that I was going to adapt the stories that Doyle had written for the stage. The idea was to create an episodic theatre series, with a recurring cast, and connected stories. Central Alberta Theatre was the logical home for The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes series, as their support of local artists is second to none in Central Alberta. My hope is that our mysteries that we present in the Nickle Studio will create a new excitement for the source materials created by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. It all started with Doyle, and it is to his spirit of adventure that I dedicate this series to.

Anyone that has worked in theatre knows that it takes a team of incredibly devoted people to put on a show. This series would not be possible without the editing ability of my wife, Tara Koett, the constant assistance of Nicole Leal and Braden Guido, the CAT Board of Directors, the wonderful designers, the fantastic cast, the multi-talented crew, and of course the incomparable front of house. 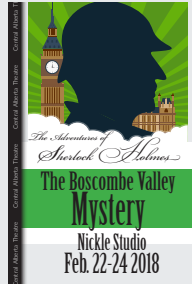
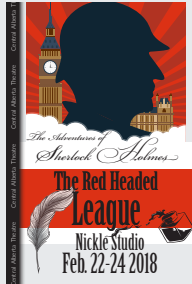
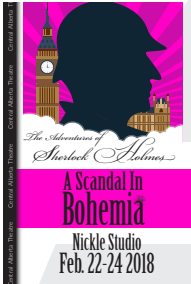
